# <u>Setting task each week</u>

Some parents said it would be beneficial to receive the timetable for the week in advance, in order to prepare any resources, ensure links work, etc. With this in mind, we are now going to send the task timetables on a <u>Friday afternoon</u> (except for this week-the task timetable will be sent out first thing tomorrow morning!)

### Exercise books

If your child runs out of room with their home learning exercise books, they can continue their learning on paper or in another note book. If you don't have access to paper of a form of book which they can record their learning in, please email the school office, so we can arrange something for you.

#### Evidence Me

82% of parents who completed the survey said they were uploading photos and evidence onto Evidence Me. This is fantastic! We really love receiving photos of your children and finding out what they have been up to. Please remember to add some notes to your photos too, so we know what your child did, how much support they had and their achievements too! It might be something like this: "XXX counted 16 leaves in the garden independently, before making shapes out of them. XXX could name and describe a circle, square and triangle." The teachers will continue to approve the observations and add notes.
