We have been so busy practising for our first Nativity! The children were all wonderful sheep and learnt so many different songs, which I am sure they have been singing at home for you! In addition to this, the children have been learning all about the story of Christmas and went to visit Father John in church.

All of the children in Nursery now have a name card and have been working hard to practise writing the letters in their name. Well done, everyone! In maths, we have been consolidating our knowledge of numbers to 5, as well as learning all about shapes. The children enjoyed going on a shape hunt around school, looking for all of the shapes we have been learning about.

Our children say...

"We made baubles and I am going to put it on my tree."

"I like playing in the water with the ice. It melted."

"I like the Wriggly Nativity song. We did a show."



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Thank you to the parents who were able to attend this term's 'Stay & Play' sessions or the Reception Christmas Crafts afternoon. It was a wonderful opportunity to share our learning with you and the children had a wonderful time!

We have been learning all about the story of the first Christmas. In the creative area, we worked carefully to build a nativity scene picture. In the small world area, we have been roleplaying and pretending to be the different characters. In the writing area, we independently wrote lists of things we would like for Christmas. The teachers were so impressed with our application of new sounds from phonics and with our beautiful letter formation.

In mathematics this term, we have focused on building repeating patterns, sequencing objects from heaviest to lightest, as well as exploring the numbers 6 and 7.

Our children say...

"I love making Christmas cards. I can write my name!"

"The Nativity area is so fun! I was the donkey."

"I do numbers every day. I can use the weighing scales."





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Thank you to all of our families for their support towards our annual Christmas carol concert. It was lovely to see all of the children show so much confidence when performing.

In Music this term with Mrs Dewsnap, we have been learning all about percussion instruments and rhythms. We have had the opportunity to play various instruments and have begun learning songs.

In English, we have been nibbling our way to Christmas. We have loved reading all about Nibbles the Book Monster and writing diary entries as if we are him. If you see him in this newsletter please let us know so we can catch him! This term in Maths, we have been learning about addition and subtraction. We have been looking at how to use number lines, number sentences and deepening our understanding answering reasoning questions.

Our children say...

"I loved singing Rudolf the Red Nose Reindeer and playing my air guitar!"

"Bringing one of my toys in and sharing them with my friends was really, really fun."

"Watching Mr Westbrook and Miss Ryan throw water at us in Science when testing materials for how waterproof they were made me laugh so much!"



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Christmas Nativity: The children did a fab job and delivered the most amazing production of 'Little Angel gets her Wings'. They sang with enthusiasm and acted their hearts out – watch out, X-factor here we come!

In Topic, we have been learning all about The Great Fire of London, how and why it started and how London changed for the better after it occurred. We even looked at the Plague, where it originated and how it impacted life in the UK. We had a fantastic day bringing our topic to life during our Great Fire of London day.

In Maths, we have been working on addition and subtraction using the partitioning, number line and column method. Through true perseverance, we have learnt lots of strategies to ensure we are mathmagicians.

In English, we have been learning all about owls to write our own owl fact file. We used the internet to research lots of information to help us create our final piece of writing. Should you fancy reading the BEST owl fact files in Didsbury, head on down to Year 2!


Our children say...

"I loved doing the Christmas play and I'm so proud of my performance. I think our show has definitely got the X-Factor!" "I had so much fun during our Great Fire of London day. I loved making the 17th century biscuits. They were delicious!"

"I loved learning about owls and the most interesting fact I learnt was that owls can move their heads in almost any direction."







In PE, we have been learning the skills of cricket. We have learnt how to bowl and bat. We definitely have some future cricket stars in Year 3! In Art, we have been exploring different textures and choosing the correct pencil to help us achieve different effects. We've had to observe objects carefully to achieve the desired effect.

In Maths, we have been learning all about column addition and subtraction and applying these new skills to challenging questions. We are really proud of our problem-solving skills and also our resilience when learning new concepts.

In Music, Mrs Dewsnap has been teaching us many songs and also how to play Ukulele. Our favourite song that we have learnt this half term is 'Creepy Castle.'

Our children say...

"I like my flute lessons because you get to learn about different parts of the flute and you get to learn different songs- like jingle bells!" "I have liked learning new things that help to make our writing better such as time adverbials, similes and expanded noun phrases."

"I enjoyed using the different grades of pencil and exploring different patterns and designs."



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In Design Technology, we researched the chef Raffaelle Esposito. He created the original margarita pizza using the colours of the Italian flag. We used his idea to design, make and evaluate our own pizzas using only red (pepperoni, tomatoes, red peppers), green (basil, olives, peppers) and white (mozzarella cheese) ingredients. They were delicious!

In Science, we have been busy learning all about the water cycle. We had lots of fun creating our own version of the water cycle using sandwich bags and water. We stuck these onto the windows and observed the different stages such as evaporation, condensation and precipitation.

Our Topic this term is the Vikings, which has been great! We really enjoyed the Launch Day, where we learned all about Viking long boats. During a research lesson, we used the iPads to learn all about Lindisfarne which was invaded by Vikings in the 8th Century.

During PSHE this term, a focus has been managing dares. This has involved interesting discussions about 'risk' and 'challenges' and how to resist peer pressure to participate in risky behaviour.

Our children say...

"I loved making our own pizzas – I was even brave enough to try a jalapeno pepper!"

"Our Viking topic has been really interesting – they were a brutal bunch! I loved making a Viking long boat for homework!"

"The Science experiment was really fun as we got to melt chocolate and sugar!"





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In Science, we have been learning about properties of everyday materials. We have conducted scientific enquiries to discover which materials work best for specific purposes. We've investigated which materials work best as insulators, which materials are best for conducting electricity and which are best suited for food preparation and cleaning.

In English, we have been working on writing our own traditional tales based on Carol Ann Duffy's book, 'The Lost Happy Endings'. We've also explored Neil Gaiman's version of 'Hansel and Gretel', using it as inspiration for our setting and character descriptions. In Spanish, we have made cards introducing ourselves to our pen friends in Spain and using our Spanish vocabulary words to describe likes and interests. These have been posted to our pen friends and we can't wait to hear back from them. We also learned a Spanish traditional 'villancico' (Christmas carol) and sang for the Spanish children during our video call this week!

Anti-Bullying Week provided an excellent opportunity to discuss how we can 'REACH OUT' to others and make our school a kind and caring environment. We have also discussed empathy, peer pressure and showing respect in our friendships.

Our children say...

"I loved Spanish because we got to spend time on video calls with our penfriends and we also got to sing for them!"

"I liked learning about conductors and insulators because we get to do experiments and learn outside our books!"

"Anti–Bullying Week was inspiring and fun – we got to design a poster, we had Odd Socks Day and we thought of ways to reach out to others!"







In Computing, we have been working with MGL to code crumbles, which we then used as part of our DT project to create prototypes of festive garden lights. We used our coding knowledge to sequence how the lights worked in our designs and the colours that they were as well. The children were so focused in these lessons and this resulted in amazing work that was produced.

In Topic, the children have looked at the discrimination that Jewish people faced under the Nazi regime. To help us to understand this, we studied extracts from Anne Frank's diary, Kristallnacht and the anti-Jewish laws. After this, we looked at the Battle of Britain and how this led to the Blitz. The children have really enjoyed this unit of work and are looking forward to their new unit in January.

In English, we have continued to expand our knowledge of how to write a variety of genres by understanding the key features of these. The children have now become more familiar with the different tenses that are needed and how to apply these in the different genres. More recently, we have focused on non-chronological reports and explanation texts. In PE, we have been working with City in the Community on their Christmas Social Action Project, to help those in the local area. This has been achieved by donating food items and creating Christmas cards to be shared with them. Year 6 have really enjoyed their time with Mr Heath, working on strike & field games and invasion games too.

Our children say...

"I loved coding the lights to be all different colours and getting them to flash as well. It was a lot of fun and it made my design come to life." "Learning about Anne Frank and what happened to the Jewish people has taught me that we should never let history repeat itself and we must learn from it. "

"I like changing my writing 'cap,' depending on which genre that I am writing. "

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Student Leadership
