#### This Half-Term...

As always, it's been a jam-packed half-term with lots of fantastic learning and exciting events. We started our half-term with Storytelling Week (see the next page for more details!) which is always a much-loved time of our year and is quickly becoming an annual St. Catherine's tradition. We've celebrated St. Patrick's Day, World Book Day, our Core Value Day of Faith and more. Our Year 5 children organised their very own Spanish Cafe for parents where they set up our hall in the style of a cafe, created Spanish menus and served as waiters, providing refreshments for everyone, with plenty of Spanish language skills being practised too!

We've loved inviting our families into school for lots of different events this half-term, including Stay and Play sessions, St Patrick's Day, reading sessions, class worships, our Spanish Cafe and Reception crafts.

World Book Day was a great success as always and we loved seeing everyone's fantastic costumes, especially during our morning parade.

Our children loved having the opportunity to take part in a book swap to take home a new book. We were also super impressed with the puppet designs that came in as part of our Storytelling Week challenge. We are currently in the process of displaying them in our KS2 corridor!









# Nursery





#### This Half-Term...

Our topic this half term has been Journeys and Transport. We have enjoyed listening to and learning the story, 'The Journey Home from Grandpa's'. We have been sequencing the story and, in our writing, made our own story maps too, using our increasing sound knowledge to add labels!

In maths, we have been focusing on numbers 6, 7 and 8! We have been working hard to count, recognise and order numbers and even started counting two groups of objects to find how many there are altogether!

We had a surprise visit from National Highways, who brought a 'Gritter Truck' to school. We learnt all about how this vehicle and the people who drive it, keeping our roads safe in the cold, winter months.

We loved inviting parents, grandparents and even brothers and sisters into Nursery for our Stay and Play sessions. Everyone was invited to paint a picture of a daffodil, as we have also been busy learning about spring too! We have made a wonderful 'Daffodilly Day' display as you enter Nursery. Look out for it when you drop off or collect your child!

#### Our children say...

"We have been learning about the number 7. 1,2,3,4,5,6,7."

"In our story, they found loads of vehicles on the journey home. My favourite is the orange toy truck and the red fire engine."

"We have been learning about transport. I know different vehicles. A gritter came to see us at school!" "I know shapes. Square, rectangle, circle."

"If you put two rectangles together, it makes a square."







# **Reception**





#### This Half-Term...

Our topic this half term is 'Journeys & Transport'. We have loved exploring different types of vehicles. We know what vehicles travel on land, in the sea and air. We also compared old vehicles to new ones and discussed journeys we have been on e.g. our journey to school or on holiday.

In Religion, we have focused on Lent. We made promises which we have tried to keep during Lent. Together we wrote our promises on leaves to create 'Our Lent Tree', to remind us to keep our promises and be kind as Jesus has taught us. In Mathematics, we have been focusing on our number bonds to 5, recalling automatically how we can build the number 5. We can show this on a part-part-whole model and with numicon. We also explored using weighing scales to investigate which objects are heavier and lighter. Then we discovered we could put 5 on one side of the balance and our number bonds on the other to show they were equal.

In our creative area, we have begun to access our paints independently. Look at our transport painting masterpieces!

### Our children say...


"We've been learning about the Naughty Bus. He's so cheeky. He went through the eggs and beans in the story!"

#### This Half-Term...

In PE this half-term, we have been working with Mr Borjis and have been developing our gymnastic skills. We have learnt about balance, using our core and how to do handstands independently!

This half-term, we were also invited to Manchester City F.C for a fun morning helping up develop our ball skills. We had a great time meeting the coaches and working in teams.

In Maths, we have been learning about measurement. We have focused on different concepts of measuring such as mass, volume, length, height and weight. We have used different units when measuring and have been developing using correct mathematical vocabulary when answering reasoning questions.

In Music with Mrs Dewsnap, we have been focusing on a project called Nautilus where we have been learning about the composer Anna Meredith. During this project, we have expressed ourselves through dance, music and discussion.

#### Our children say...

"I can finally do a handstand! I know now I need to keep my arms straight to make sure I don't wobble!"

"I loved going to Manchester City, I want to be a footballer when I grow up."

"I liked in Religion when we learnt about change. It was fun seeing what I can do now and what I could do when I was a baby."









#### This Half-Term...

In English this half-term, has been focusing on our text Major Glad and Major Dizzy. We have made our own soldier and created suitable instructions. We have also been focusing on writing in the present and past progressive tense and created fantastic diary entries in character.

In Religion, we have been learning about Mass and the different parts of it. The children also celebrated their Class Worships; they read beautifully, sang their hearts out and brought the Gospel to life. We couldn't have been any prouder of them.

In Topic, we have been learning about the five oceans and seven continents. We used salt-dough to create a map of the world and we have learnt a special rap to help us remember the different continents.

In Science, we have been learning all about habitats. We have learnt about how animals adapt to their environment and we have gone on a walk around school to explore the different micro-habitats in our area.

"I loved our Worship, especially singing our songs."

"I loved World Book Day because we got to dress up in different things and have a parade."

"I love that our Worships taught us lots of new facts."

#### This Half-Term...

This half-term, we started our new topic: From Riches to Ruins, which is all about the Romans. We loved our school trip to Chester. We had great fun trying out Roman formations. Take a look at some of our photos with our Roman shields – don't we look great!

In Design and Technology, we have been making pop up pictures, using our knowledge of levers. We have been very creative with our ideas.

In English, we have been looking at the importance of looking after our oceans and the damage that plastic can sadly do to wildlife – particularly whales.

In Art, we have been focusing on Eric Carle and the wonderful art he produced. We have mixed paint to make our own paper, and cut shapes out of it to make different animals and insects.

"I loved using paint to create my own paper colours!"


"Our school trip was amazing – I even enjoyed the coach ride!"

#### This Half-Term...

In Maths this half-term, we have been learning about Perimeter. As part of an Active Maths lesson we went into the playground to measure different sized rectangles. The children had great fun working together practically to measure the angles and loved being outside!

During our Science unit on electricity, we have built our own switches using paper clips and split. We also carried out an investigation where we tested materials to find out if they were conductors or insulators.

Year 4 were lucky enough to take part in a Carbon Ruins workshop lead by Manchester Museum. We learned all about sustainability and had lots of fun being in role as museum exhibitors.

In Computing we have been learning all about Computer Aided Designs (CAD). We researched the graphic designer Rob Janoff (who designed Apple's famous logo) and used his original idea to then create our own logos for an Easter Egg gift box!

#### Our children say...

"I enjoyed going outside to measure rectangles. It was great to work with the other class!"

"I really enjoyed the Carbon Ruins project. It was really interesting to discuss how our world will have changed by the year 2051."

"I really enjoyed making the switch in Science, but it took a lot of perseverance to light up the bulb!"













#### This Half-Term...

In Maths this half term, we have been working on fractions. We have learnt to add and subtract simple fractions as well as mixed number fractions.

During one of our Science lessons about Earth and Space, we used Oreos to help us understand the phases of the moon. We loved showing off our learning whilst working with Oreos!

Our new topic this term is 'Didsbury to Nigran'. We have used atlases and digital maps to gain a better understanding of the distance and physical features of both areas as well as learning to use a scale bar on a map.

This term, Year 5 have worked extremely hard in Spanish developing menus for the Spanish Café and learning how to take orders. This was a huge success with parents/carers and even Year 4 children experiencing some Spanish flavours! Thank you to everyone who was able to join us for our two wonderful Spanish Cafes. We hope you had a great time!

#### Our children say...

"I found fractions a bit hard at first but now I know that I can use my times tables to help me."
"The phases of the moon lesson was my favourite; we learnt about the waxing and waning of the moon and we even got to eat the Oreos at the end!"

"The Spanish Café was so good! Everyone used our menus and we got to serve them tapas!"













#### This Half-Term...

During our Maths lessons we have been learning about decimals. We have been partitioning, adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing them, whilst developing our reasoning skills through our Donald questions.

Our English and Reading lessons have been focusing on the text 'The Explorer'; we have had lots of exciting writing opportunities and have been looking forward to reading a new chapter each day – we can't wait to find out what happens!

In Science, our topic has been 'Evolution and Inheritance'. We have learnt all about Charles Darwin and his theory of evolution, adaption, natural selection and why we look the way we do. This information has also informed our writing.

Death and New Life has been our topic in Religion lessons this half term. We have reflected and explored what the bread of life really means, as well as developing our knowledge of scripture and relating this to our own experiences.

### Our children say...

"I have enjoyed learning about biomes in Geography; it was interesting to learn about the human impact on biomes."

"Our art lessons about Roald Dahl have been really fun. I enjoyed seeing the steps he took to achieve his final outcome and then have a go myself."
"I loved our gymnastics lessons this half term. Every week, we built on our learning from the week before by learning new skills and combining them all into a sequence."





# Sporting Achievements



It's been another busy but successful half-term of sporting. Firstly, our Year 5 and 6 boys' football team won the South Manchester Excel League, meaning they've progressed to the next stage of the Manchester-wide competition. They have already played their first match and won, so they're through again to the next round!

Some of our Year 5 and 6 girls represented St. Catherine's at a Manchester Excel Netball Tournament. They played incredibly well and achieved second place, meaning they progress to the Manchester Finals. Well done, girls!
