

Our Spanish children have then participated in lots of fun activities throughout the week, including a range of different carousel activities, reading to our younger children, Forest School, a trip to the Science and Industry Museum, our infamous Singing Square and more! Nursery





This Half-Term...

This half term in Nursery, our topic has been 'Food & Growth'. We set up a fruit and veg shop in our role play area and the children painted pictures of their favourite fruits and vegetables to display. We even planted cress seeds too and have been making observations about how they change and develop over time. The children have enjoyed 'shopping', using different coins to pay for the things they wanted to buy. In Maths, we have been learning lots about size and measures. We have been learning to use different language to describe height, weight and capacity and investigating measures all around our learning environment.

Our focus texts have been Jasper's Beanstalk and Oliver's Vegetables. We have used our imaginations to think about what might be at the top of a beanstalk and developed our language to describe different vegetables. Our 'Words of the Week' have been: grow, sprinkle, delighted, frustrated, crinkly and tangle.

We have absolutely loved our gymnastics lessons with Mr Borjus! The children have been learning to travel like gymnasts in lots of different ways. We cannot wait to continue our lessons in the summer 2 term!

Our children say...

"We've been measuring how big and how small they are and how light and how heavy they are."

"We've been learning about vegetables and fruit because it's healthy."

"I like playing in the playdough because it's sticky."







Reception





This Half-Term...

This half-term we have been working hard on our topic of 'Food and Growth'. We have been busy growing cress and watching how it changes over time, painting fruits and vegetables as well as learning lots of new vocabulary associated with our topic.

To continue with this theme in English, we have been reading 'The Runaway Pea' and 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. We even planted our own beans and we were very excited to see if they would grow into our very own beanstalks!

In Maths this half-term, we have focused a lot on subtracting numbers within 10. We have done this in lots of different ways such as a teddy bear's picnic (with one greedy bear) and we have even splatted PlayDoh to show the number being subtracted!

This half term, we welcomed Grandparents into our classrooms. We performed a song for them, explored the classroom with them, painted a picture of them and then presented them with medals we had made to tell them how wonderful they are!

Our children say...

"You have to put water in the soil and the seeds then you put it out in the sunshine and it will grow."

"We planted some beans and it turned into an enormous beanstalk like Jack's but it wasn't big enough to climb!"

"I painted with my Granny and showed her the reading corner and she read a nice story to me."











This Half-Term...

This term in Computing, we have been learning about programming and coding using Scratch Junior. We have been creating our characters using Sprites, which has been really exciting!

In Science, we have been learning all about plants and have sown our own beans! We have learnt about how plants grow, what they need and are hoping they will grow into magic beanstalks!

Throughout this half-term, we have been learning about Holy days and holidays in both our Religion and Collective worship sessions. We have loved learning about Pentecost in particular.

In Maths, we have become super mathematicians this half-term! We have learnt about fractions and divisions by sharing.

Our children say...

"I loved planting my own bean. I hope so much it grows!"

"I loved writing about my own toys in my story and how the space creature took them to a cold castle."

"Music has been fun, we even got to play some instruments like a glockenspiel!"











This Half-Term...

In English, we have been reading our focus text, 'The Last Wolf'. We have been learning about endangered animals and working towards creating a persuasive letter to encourage people to stop deforestation and to plant more trees and flowers.

In Art, we have been learning about Paul Klee, in particular his painting 'Castle in the Sun'. We used 2D shapes to recreate our own version of this painting and our final versions are absolute masterpieces!

We have been learning all about animals and their habitats in Science and it has been lots of fun. We created our own bug hotels for some minibeasts, many of which even had a pent-house suite and we placed them in the school peace garden. To finish off our topic we had a visit from some animals – a fennec fox, an owl, chameleon, tarantula and a snake. We loved getting to learn lots of facts about the animals and we even got to hold them!

In Design Technology, we worked really hard to create our own fruit kebabs. We washed, chopped and prepared all of the fruit and we loved getting to taste the delights of our hard work.

Our children say...

"I LOVED when the animals came to class and I can't believe I was brave enough to hold a tarantula. My mummy would have passed out if she saw me."

"Our fruit kebabs were so tasty and I even got to try some new fruits." "I was so proud of my bug hotel and I can't wait to watch all the minibeasts enjoy their new home."







This Half-Term...

In Maths, we have been learning all about fractions and we are fraction superstars! We can add and subtract fractions and even find a fraction of an amount.

In English, we have been using the book 'Journey' to help write descriptively. Journey is a wordless book, so we have to use our detective skills to infer lots of the information.

In Science, we have been learning about plants and have been taking part in lots of experiments to help improve our understanding, which we've really enjoyed!

In RE, we have been learning about Pentecost and the Power of the Holy Spirit. We also went to the Marist Centre, where we participated in many activities that helped us prepare for our first Holy Communion.

Our children say...

"I've really enjoyed learning all about the Romans – I loved learning about Boudica and how her army was defeated by 10,000 Romans, even though Boudica's army has 70,000!"

"I loved acting and dancing in my class worship about Pentecost- it was really fun!"

"I loved our trip to the Marist centre. I loved creating a rap all about kindness."











This Half-Term...

We have had the wonderful opportunity to visit our local area as part of our River study in Topic. The children spent time learning about the River Mersey: where is starts and ends; the different stages to a river; which insects can be found in rivers; the impacts flooding can have on homes, businesses, travel etc. The children LOVED their experience of canoeing down the River Mersey!

In Music, we have been learning a song for our singing square. The song the children have worked hard rehearsing with Mrs Dewsnap is 'You are one in a million'. It was an amazing experience performing this to other year groups and our Spanish visitors! Our Spanish visitors arrived and the children have had an amazing time participating in carousel activities with our Spanish friends. The children joined in art activities based on landmarks of England, PE activities, lots of games and many more! In Maths, we have been exploring fractions and decimals. It has been tricky stuff but we've persevered and are now able to recognise tenths and hundredths! We always try to apply our Maths in every day life so have explored exampled such as fractions in recipes and comparing petrol prices using out decimals point knowledge!

Our children say...

"I really enjoyed canoeing down the River Mersey. It was hard work and we were exhausted after it but it was lots of fun!"

"Welcoming our Spanish children onto the playground was really exciting! It has been an amazing week getting to know the children and the activities in the carousels have been enjoyable!" "Maths has been tricky but fun. I really liked our Discovery lesson where we learnt about the Persian Mathematician Al-Kahwarizmi – the 'Father of Algebra!"







This Half-Term...

We kicked off this half term with the Spanish leg of the Spanish Exchange. Our children thoroughly enjoyed their trip to Spain. They spent time with their pen pals as well as experiencing school life in Nigran! We had an amazing week of different Spanish—themed activities for those who stayed in Didsbury, including Flamenco dancing, tennis and tapas (with very kind collaboration from El Rincon de Rafa).

The Manchester leg of the Spanish exchange has just come to an end and despite some very exhausted children, we have had a great time welcoming them at St. Catherine's and showing them what a fantastic school community we have! It has been so wonderful having the Spanish children in class with us and our children have been lucky to participate in different carousel–style activities where they've been able to learn new skills and take part in lots of fun tasks.

This term we have also worked hard on computing and have had an introduction into sorting data into spreadsheets, using Microsoft Excel.

Our children say...

"I loved meeting my pen pal in Nigran and going to their school, I learnt lots of Spanish. My favourite activity was going to the beach and surfing."

"My pen pal didn't want to leave, they want to come back to St Catherine's next year!"

"I know a bit more about how to use spreadsheets properly by using Excel. I think I could do an easy one by myself now."









This Half-Term...

This term, we have been reading the text 'Skychasers' by Emma Carroll, and this has contributed to both our reading and writing lessons. The children have produced some great diary entries as well as prototypes for a 'flying machine'.

In Art, we have been studying the artist David Hockney, and have used the Ipads to generate electronic art in his style – the level of detail and creativity has blown us away!

In PE, we have been playing lots of rounders as well as developing our gymnastics skills. We have been working towards a 'performance piece' using all of our gymnastics knowledge to create a sequence.


In Spanish, we have been learning how to talk about the weather in Spanish, as well as learning compass points and directions. We have also been incredibly lucky to work with our two Spanish student teachers who have taught us how to follow a Spanish recipe for chocolate cake! You might want to make this at home!
