The new toilets will all be cubicle-based, rather than urinals for the boys, meaning we will be able to split the new toilets into boys' and girls' cubicles whilst we await the completion of the current girls' toilets.

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# **Catholic Schools Inspection**

We are delighted with the outcome of our recent Catholic Schools Inspection and how inspectors recognised and commented on so many wonderful elements of our school community.

Some of the highlights of the report are:

- Pupils actively contribute to the mission of the school. They have a clear understanding of St Catherine's Catholic identity and are able to articulate the school mission statement and how it impacts the life of their school. Indeed, one child stated 'It is the middle of everything. It is the reason for everything we do.'

- Pupils understand that they are valued and cared for in this loving community.

- Pupils make good progress in knowing more and remembering more and can speak with confidence about what they have been learning in religious education lessons over time. Pupils enjoy their lessons. As one pupil said, 'School is better for having RE lessons.'

- The mission statement is known, lived and witnessed throughout the school day.

- There is a culture of welcome that extends to the whole community.

The school is a supportive and joyful community and is appreciated by parents. One parent stated, 'My husband and I feel lucky to have found this school'.

- Teachers have high expectations of pupils in religious education lessons using sacred scripture as the starting point in all lessons observed.

We are really proud of our fantastic school community!











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This half term, our topic has been Minibeasts! We started the half term with some caterpillars in our classroom and focused on the story, The Very Hungry Caterpillar. We looked closely and carefully to changes and after a few weeks, our caterpillars emerged from their cocoons as beautiful butterflies! We enjoyed setting them free.

In Maths, we have been looking at different ways to make numbers, as well as addition and subtraction number problems! We have also recapped our shape knowledge through our focus text, Walter's Wonderful Web.

We have been investigating symmetry too and used pipettes to put paint on one side of a butterfly, folded the paper and pressed down, before revealing our beautiful, symmetrical butterflies!

We have enjoyed lots of other wonderful events, such as Stay and Play sessions with our grown-ups, Sports Day, our first ever class worship, our visit to Didsbury Park and of course our end of year beach party. We have had so much fun!

### Our children say...

"We have been learning about minibeasts. Some of them can fly because they have wings."

"We had Sports Day! We had to do the egg and spoon race and we had to throw beanbags into the hoop."

"A farmer came to see us. He brought animals! I liked the alpaca."









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We had a wonderful trip to Didsbury Park. We completed all sorts of activities such as parachute games, minibeast hunts, building fairy houses and elf dens and using the zip line.

Our topic of Minibeasts means we have learnt lots of facts and information about insects through the story 'Christopher's Caterpillars'. Christopher sent us some live caterpillars to look after. We were amazed to see them change into a chrysalis. This helped our investigation into life cycles and we had a ceremony to release the butterfly which emerged.

We had lots of animal visitors from the farm who came into our playground. We feed chickens, goats, ducks, sheep and even took an alpaca for a walk! We have been focusing on the concept of 'doubling' in Mathematics. First, we generated a number to double using the number fans. Then we counted out the correct number of counters and showed how this could be doubled using a mirror. We know that to double means having two lots of the same amount.

#### Our children say...

"I love learning about minibeasts. We did the 'Minibeasts Rave Song' with Mrs Dewsnap. I can dance like a ladybird!"

"We had real caterpillars in our classroom. They went into a chrysalis and turned into a butterfly."

"I know all about doubles. It needs to be the same lot of two numbers. 6+6=12."









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This term in Topic, we have been learning about "Our School". We have had various visits from past pupils such as footballer Emilio Lawrence and even took a trip down School Lane to learn about the area our school is in.

We have been developing our artistic skills in Design Technology as we have made our own mobiles inspired by sculptor Alexander Calder. We loved bringing our creative side to our learning!

In Religion, we have been learning about the importance of being sorry. We have loved listening to Jesus' teaching and sharing ways we can use what we have learnt both in and out of the classroom.

As a celebration of our successes, this year we shared a joint "St. Cathsbury Farewell Festival" with Year 2. We thoroughly enjoyed the various activities such as face paintings, tattoos and the live band who came to play for us. It was lovely having the opportunity to celebrate our hard work in style!

### Our children say...

"The festival day was the best day ever! It was fun dancing on the playground with my friends. I can't wait for next year's already." "I loved learning about money in Maths. I liked understanding the difference between coins and notes." "Learning about St. Catherine's has been one of my favourite topics. I like learning about how old the school is and how it has changed."







As part of our Science topic about animals, we went on a trip to Knowsley Safari park. Here we went on a safari drive with one of the park rangers and learnt all about the animals. We also watched a birds of prey display and a sealion show! It was so much fun and it really helped to bring our topic to life.

Our Design Technology topic this half-term was all about moving mechanisms. We worked in small groups to design and make our own car. We used Hot Wheels car designs as our inspiration. Our cars looked amazing and we are awaiting a call from Formula One!

As a celebration of our successes, this year we shared a joint "St. Cathsbury Farewell Festival" with Year 1. We thoroughly enjoyed the various activities such as face paintings, tattoos and the live band who came to play for us. It was lovely having the opportunity to celebrate our hard work in style! We have been learning how to represent, interpret and answer questions in statistics. We have looked at tally charts, bar charts and pictographs. We have made our own class tally chart based on our favourite sports and answered lots of questions. We have also been focussing on positional language and using vocabulary to help direct each other.

"I loved making a car in DT with my friends and I'm going to try and convince my Dad to let me design our new car."







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This half-term has been a very special one for many of our Year 3 children as they made their First Holy Communion in June. We were privileged to join our children on their sacramental journey and we made sure we celebrated this wonderful faith milestone in school too.

In Topic, we have been learning all about Didsbury. We have been finding out about all the human and physical characteristics.

In Art, we have been looking at the work of Claude Monet. We have been using different paints and brushes to create a variety of effects. We've also been We have enjoyed sewing in Design Technology and have been very creative with our designs. We realised how mindful and fun sewing can be.

In Maths, we have been looking at shape and even had a go at making our own 3D shapes using spaghetti and marshmallows. It was challenging, but we persevered, especially as we got to eat some marshmallows at the end!

#### Our children say...

"I really enjoyed coming into school in my communion dress and having a big party in the community centre and dancing on the stage."

"I loved our trip to Didsbury Park!"

"I've learnt so much about Zeraffa Giraffa and now want to visit Jardin de Plantes."







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In Maths, we have been learning about money, converting pounds to pence and pence into pounds. We have used our estimating skills and even calculated money! One of our favourite lessons was playing supermarket sweep and challenging ourselves with more than one and two step problems! Our new Topic has focused on our city of Manchester. We have looked at what Manchester is like, what human and physical features have shaped Manchester and what the landscape of Manchester is like. The children had the amazing opportunity to visit the Manchester Science and Industry Museum. In English, we have been focusing on the book 'Blue John'. We have created some amazing pieces of writing describing the inside of a cave and had a main focus on the type of technical vocabulary that we use.

We have had the exciting opportunity to create a light up sign in Design Technology. As part of our project, we had to create a circuit using copper tape, a battery and a bulb in order for the sign to light up. This was so much fun and everybody's cards were amazing!

### Our children say...

"I like learning about all the different places of Manchester and what parts are man-made and which are formed naturally." "Maths has been very enjoyable and taught me a lot about money in everyday life. My favourite part was super market sweep because it was very competitive! "I really like the book Blue John and I have learnt some new words such as stalagmites, stalactites, limestone, era, Epoch and many more!"









This half term, we were lucky enough to be invited to The Barlow for 'Environment Day'. This was a fantastic day where the children were taught how to take care of their environment and even how to up-cycle food to make pizzas!

In English, we have been working on creative writing skills based on the book 'The Hunter'. The children have worked hard on their descriptive writing and have produced some wonderful stories for their write-away.

Year 5 children have been working hard in Design and Technology to research and design a pulley or lever system. Many children chose to create a flag pole with a pulley, using household items. It was great to see the final designs which the children could then evaluate in their booklets.

In Topic, we have been looking at the county of Lancashire. We have researched the human and physical features of Lancashire and compared them to similar sized regions in Europe. We also had great fun using Atlases to find the capital cities of neighbouring European countries!

#### Our children say...

"I liked going to The Barlow and especially making pizzas; it was good because usually you would just throw that food away but now I know how to make a pizza out of it."

"The Hunter has been my favourite book in English this year. I loved learning all about the elephants and being able to describe them in my writing."









The Year 6 production of Super Stan has been a huge part of our life at school. The children have loved performing, making props, designing the set and choreographing the dances. It was a fantastic team effort and we are bursting with pride.

During our History lessons, we explored a new topic 'Early Islamic Civilisation'. The children created a timeline of events and researched how Early Islamic Civilisation became such a major world power.

Year 6 children have become skilled and elegant gymnasts this half term due to their gymnastic lessons with Mr Borjus. They have developed their skills each week and performed to our Nursery children.

The children worked hard in groups to deliver a weather update for Spain during their Spanish lessons this half-term. These weather updates were amazing, a fantastic collaboration and involved very funny props!

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# Music with Mrs Dewsnap



<u>Musical Learning in Lower KS2</u> Both Years 3 and 4 have taken part enthusiastically in learning the Ukulele and made great progress with this instrument. The children have learned chords to accompany Calypso Music, 'The Tango' and 'The Blues,' and have appreciated and listened to different music from many cultures including South Africa and America.

Children in both KS1 and KS2 have learned about composers past and present from Beethoven, Bob Marley and The Beatles to modern day women composers who have pioneered for gender equality including Anna Meredith and Shiva Feshereki. All our pupils took part confidently in our 'Singing Squares' this year. We welcomed our Spanish friends who delighted us with their rendition of the song 'Flowers' by Miley Cyrus. They were amazing and inspired us all to sing it!











<u>Musical Learning in Upper KS2</u> Our pupils have had the experience of learning to play some tunes on the guitar and our Year 5 children have even accompanied our hymn singing brilliantly in church. Our Year 6 children had some awesome lessons using Music Technology to compose and perform incredible raps, wrote their own poetic lyrics and chose instrumental backgrounds as an accompaniment.

#### <u>Choir</u>

Our wonderfully talented school choir has had an amazing year that has included our annual trip to sing with 8,000 other children from Manchester schools at the 'Young Voices' concert. It is always a spectacular event and never fails to please, especially this year as we were truly privileged to sing 'Proud' alongside Heather Small and were fortunate to have made a unique single with her of her iconic song! The choir has had an incredible time rocking it to Soul and Motown music at the prestigious Bridgewater Hall and many donned their 70's outfits to befit the occasion! Our children have also sung Christmas carols at 'The Parrswood Pub' for 'Didsbury Good Neighbours,' taken part in an open-air Nativity at Withington Baths and most recently have sung a medley of songs alongside other instrumentalists and performers at a Charity Concert in church in aid of 'OpenDoors', which raised £2000!
