Parent Governor Election

The current phase of building work has been competed and we look forward to Phase 2 starting over the half term break. This will involve relocating the main entrance to the rear of the school, meaning that parents and visitors will no longer have to cross the playground to access the Office when school is in operation. This is on schedule to be ready by September.
