This Half-Term...

We've had a wonderful start to the new school year and lots of exciting learning opportunities already. We have celebrated Black History Month during October and each year group was assigned a Black British person to find out more about, someone who has made a difference to our country. We've also celebrated 'Other Faiths Week', where we've learnt more about the faith of Judaism. Mrs Dewsnap has also arranged African Drumming workshops which are taking place in October and November to further develop our learning of different styles of Music.

We've also celebrated the Rosary on each Friday during October, praying a decade of the Rosary each Friday morning and learning more about the luminous mysteries. Thank you to everyone who has attended and to our children who have read and participated in our services.



Manchester Corinthians

Our girls' football team visited Fog Lane Park to witness the unveiling of a special plaque to commemorate the Manchester Corinthians Women's Football team. The Manchester Corinthians were a team of local women who were brought together at a time when the FA banned women from playing on FA affiliated grounds. Established in 1949, the team trained in Fog Lane Park and toured the world promoting the sport and demonstrating what a dedicated group of players the club possessed. This was at a time when FA affiliated clubs were banned from allowing women's games on their grounds.

Our girls were so inspired and interested to hear the stories of the Manchester Corinthians and to understand the difficulties they faced as women to be able to play football at the time. Thank you to all of the trail-blazing Manchester Corinthians for paving the road for our girls to play football – what an inspirational team!











It's been our first half term in Nursery! The children have settled into St. Catherine's nursery so well and we are so proud of everyone! Our topic has been 'All About Me', which has helped us all get to know one another. We have been doing lots of mark-making, drawing pictures of ourselves and our families too! We have even begun practising writing some of the letters in our name!

As part of Black History Month, we looked at the scientist (and astronaut) Mae Jemison. The children learnt that she was a very clever lady and wanted everyone to have the same opportunities. We worked together to make our own space rocket on the carpet. "It needs a pointy bit at the top," Lois told everyone, "And fire at the bottom," Freddie said. Our focus text has been, 'Happy To Be Me!' This has helped us to learn all about different parts of our bodies and what they do! In Maths, we have been doing lots of learning relating to shape, number and sorting. We have also been learning more about Jesus, his mummy Mary and why the cross is an important symbol in our school.

Finally, we held our first colour day of the year – orange day! The children loved mixing colours to make orange, collaging pumpkins, making things with orange playdough and sampling some orange only foods! We had the best day!

We have had a wonderful first half term in Reception. We have been blown away with the positive start all of our children have had and how well they have settled. Our topic has been 'All About Me' and we have enjoyed sharing baby photographs and photos of our families.

In Literacy, we have explored the story 'The Colour Monster' by Anna Llenas. This has led to in depth discussions on different emotions, how we feel and how different emotions are shown. We can identify which emotion is represent when the colour monster changes colour and have related this to our own experiences.

In Mathematics, we have been focusing on comparing, sorting and subitising numbers (recognising amounts without counting). We can match quantity to numerals for numbers to 5 and are focusing on having careful one-to-one correspondence when counting.

In our outdoor learning, we have loved exploring the Early Years playground. We have worked collaboratively to build in our large construction area, made delicious mud pies in the mud kitchen and have engaged in practical outdoor maths activities.

This term, we have been learning about place value within 10 in Maths. The children have been developing their reasoning skills by helping Tiny solve tricky maths questions.

In PE, the children have been playing invasion games. We have developed our spatial awareness and have been working in teams.

Our focus for Religion this half-term has been families. The children have enjoyed talking about their own families during circle time and understanding how we are all part of God's family.

In English, we have been focusing on the story "Lost and Found" by Oliver Jeffers. The children have been developing their writing skills and have started to use adjectives to describe characters. There are some future authors in Year 1!

"I liked learning about Sislin Fay Allen for Black History Month. I want to be a police officer when I am older."



Our Science topic for this term is 'materials'. Discovery Dog visited our classes and asked us to help him solve some scientific problems he was having. In order to help him, we conducted a number of fair investigations. We tested different materials to find out which material was the most absorbent and we also created a new safety jacket for Humpty Dumpty.

Our History topic this term is the Great Fire of London. As part of our launch day, we had a visit from a fire engine and some fire fighters. We got the opportunity to ask them lots of questions and we even got to use some of their equipment. As mathematicians this half-term, we have learnt about the place value of numbers. We have used different concrete resources to partition numbers and we then applied this knowledge to solve some tricky problems. We have also focused on number sequences and we have learnt how to use a 100 square to help with this.

Our focused country for International Day was Kenya. Mr. Ilagoswa visited our class and taught us some Swahili and told us some facts about Kenya. We took part in some traditional dancing and we also enjoying creating our very own necklaces using traditional patterns.

"I loved when the fire engine came to visit and I was really inspired by the fire fighters."

"International Day was so much fun and I hope I get to visit Kenya someday!"

"I really enjoyed learning how to knit and I was so proud of the fish I made."





Design technology







We have been focusing on Place Value in Maths this term in Maths. We have used many different manipulatives to help us partition numbers and we then applied this knowledge to solve problems. We have really enjoyed 'Active Maths' lessons where we have had to find the answers to questions around the classroom and corridor. In Topic, we have had our 'Launch Day' to introduce the Stone Age. We have focused on how the Stone Age people lived, the types of technology they had, tools they used and how they were hunter-gatherers. They found out about the role of archaeologists and the types of artefacts they excavated and the importance of them. In Science, we have been learning about all the five different food groups and the health benefits of food. We have sorted foods into specific groups and designed a healthy balanced meal. We have explored human and animal skeletons and recently carried out an investigation to explore if taller children could jump higher. Class 8's worship focussed on Mary, our mother. Children re-enacted the annunciation scene and showed how they could be more like Mary through roleplay. They wrote prayers to say how special Mary is in their lives and linked that to their own mothers.

In Science, we have been learning all about 'Animals and their Habitats'. We learnt how to classify animals using Liquorice Allsorts.

In Maths, we have been very busy! We have finished out Place Value Topic and we are now solving addition and subtraction problems. Some problems have more than one step, but we are using perseverance to help us succeed.

We have really enjoyed our swimming lessons on Mondays and Tuesdays. Not only are we having fun, but we are learning to keep safe in the water. We are gaining confidence each week.

Our focused country for International Day was India. We made beautiful Artwork inspired by the book: 'A pair of Twins'. We also tasted lots of authentic Indian food – a special thank you to the parents who provided this.

At the start of the academic year, we were very lucky to visit Bramhall Hall as part of our topic on the Tudors. We had a fabulous day and learned lots of facts about a Tudor household, their clothes and their secrets!

In Maths we have learned all about Place Value, so we can go through Year 5 with a secure knowledge of number. More recently, we have been learning formal written and mental methods of adding and subtracting and applying what we know to multi-step word problems.

In English, we have just completed our story 'Queen of the Falls' and we all wrote fantastic diary entries in character as Annie. We amazed our teachers with some great Y5 standard writing, including relative clauses, complex sentences and progressive and perfect verb forms!

We have really been enjoying our music lessons with Ms Dewsnap on the guitars. We have learned lots of different chords and we are excited to learn a lot more!

Year 6 have loved experimenting all things light in Science this half term. We have measured the height of shadows based on how far away the light source is and how mirrors can cause light to reflect.

In English, we have been working hard to write a flash back narrative, we have applied used tools like expanded noun phrases and adverbials to make our work descriptive.

In Maths, we have been learning and applying lots of new methods to solve addition, subtraction, multiplication and division calculations.

We have loved our World War Two topic this half term; it has been interesting to learn how the war began and which countries were significant. We studied daily life was impacted with rationing, gas masks, air raids and evacuation.
