## What is the Early Years Foundation Stage?



The EYFS is a statutory framework setting the standards for learning, development and care for children from birth to five. The framework has recently been updated and there will be an amended version in place from September 2021.

## **Overarching Principles**

There are four guiding principles should shape practice in early years settings. These are:

- every child is a unique child, who is constantly learning and can be resilient, capable, confident and self-assured
- children learn to be strong and independent through positive relationships
- children learn and develop well in enabling environments with teaching and support from adults, who respond to their individual interests and needs and help them to build their learning over time. Children benefit from a strong partnership between practitioners and parents and/or carers.
- importance of learning and development. Children develop and learn at different rates.

At the end of Reception, children are assessed against each aspect of learning (known as Early Learning Goals) with a judgement of 'emerging' in the aspect of learning, or 'expected' in the area of learning.



## **Reception Baseline**

The reception baseline assessment (RBA) is a short, task-based assessment of your child's early literacy, communication, language and mathematics skills when they begin school. The assessment will form the start of a new measure of how schools are helping their pupils to progress between reception and year 6.

## **Daily Routine**

Children arrive for Reception from 8.30am via Class 1.





The children will have a peg which they should hang their coats and book bags on.

They will then put their lunchboxes and water bottles away.







Children then come to the carpet area for their morning starter activity and the register.



Children have access to 'snack' throughout the day. This is usually a piece of fruit.





Children should bring into school their own reusable bottle of still, unflavoured water each morning. They can help themselves to this throughout the day.



## **School Uniform**





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The deadline for orders delivered to school before the summer holidays is the 15th June. For home deliveries, this is the 15th July.



#### **ParentMail**

- Communicating with parents is an important part of what we do and making sure you get the correct information about activities and events is something we care about.
- Our primary way of communicating with you is via ParentMail.

All payments to school should go through ParentMail.

We also use the forms section of ParentMail, so please check it regularly.



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#### **BENEFITS OF USING PARENTMAIL**

- Via parentmail you are able to pay and give consent for trips, buildings fund and dinner money etc.
- There is a parentmail APP if you have a iphone or smartphone.
- eLetters are stored in your account for easy access.
- Both parents can register if required.
- Siblings accounts can be linked.

## **Free School Meals**

If you get any of the following support payments your child may be entitled to receive free school meals:

- **Income Support**; or
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance; or
- Income-related Employment Support Allowance; or
- The guaranteed part of Pension Credit; or Child Tax Credit as long as it doesn't include an amount for childcare and as long as the household income is £16,190 a year or less. This income limit will be used until April 2012 but may go up in future years. Working tax Credit is not a qualifying income: or
- A Working Tax Credit 'run-on' payment for four weeks after stopping work or reducing working hours to under 16 hours a week

### Free School Meals

If your child qualifies and their school is in Manchester, you can

Apply for free school meals

You'll need to contact the school yourself if it isn't listed.

If your child's school is **outside Manchester**, their free school meals will be dealt with by the local authority the school is in. Go to the <u>GOV.UK</u> website and enter the postcode of the school your child attends to find out how to get them.

## **School Fund**

This is a voluntary donation to the school which helps provide resources. School fund has been used for additional class resources and class activities.

We give a guideline of £1 a week but it is entirely at your own discretion how much you would like to donate to the school. Some parents send a £1 in each week others send £52 for the whole year.

This can be paid through Parentmail.





## Diocesan Buildings Fund

Buildings fund is £15 this year per child.



Payable in September each year.

Here at St Catherine's we are undergoing massive building improvements which your children will benefit from in the future so it is VERY important that this fund is supported.



- Going to school regularly is important to your child's future. YOU are legally responsible for making sure they attend every day.

- Children who miss school frequently can fall behind.
- Children who miss school frequently can have difficulties with friendship groups
- When a child misses 10 days from school they have missed out on 5% of their education that school year.
