# This Half-Term...

This half-term, we have been learning more about the liturgical season of Lent and its importance within the church calendar. During Holy Week, our KS2 children created a moving reflection representing the events of Holy Week, which our EYFS and KS1 children then visited to learn more about the significance of Holy Week.

We've also held our annual STEM Day (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) which was a fantastic day of experiments, fun learning and more! We celebrated St Patrick's Day in church with Father John, followed by an event in the community centre where we invited parents and parishioners and put on some great entertainment (and refreshments!) for everyone, including Irish singing, dancing and instrumental performances! Our World Book Day celebrations were a great success too and we loved seeing everyone's costumes!



### **World Water Day**

On 22nd March, World Water Day, Justin Neal (an Environmental Lawyer) came into school to talk to our children about World Water Day and to highlight the importance of clean water in our communities and how we need to protect our water ways.

Children learnt about the impact of human actions on our water systems and the importance of changing these habits. They also learnt about the negative impact of our actions on different creatures that live in our water, including fish.

The children enjoyed learning about water pollution, the impact on our society and changes we can make to reduce this pollution. Thank you, Dr Neal!







# Lent & Holy Week





During Lent, we have been focusing on the theme of Perfect Promises, looking at different stories from the bible that reflect Jesus' journey to the cross. Our different Perfect Promise themes have included belonging, presence and guidance. We have also looked at the word 'covenant' and how this is a personal agreement of commitment. We have looked at different covenants from God and Jesus, particularly during our Lenten journey.

During Holy Week, our KS2 children worked diligently to prepare and facilitate a moving reflection of the events of Holy Week. We identified key events from Holy Week to show Jesus' journey to the cross and to reflect on the ultimate miracle of his resurrection.

Our younger children then toured around school to visit each reflection, learning more about Jesus' journey and giving thought to what this means for us as Catholics today.

We are so proud of the wonderful reflections our older children created and it was a beautiful way for our younger children to learn more about Holy Week.







### This Half-Term...

Our topic this half-term has been Journeys and Transport. We have enjoyed listening to and learning the story, 'The Journey Home from Grandpa's'. We have been sequencing the story and, in our writing, drawing and labelling our own vehicles, using our increasing knowledge of letters and their sounds! We have also been reading 'Whatever Next'. We loved imagining going on a journey to space and thinking about what we would take!

In Maths, we have been focusing on size and learning to describe things that are long, tall and short. We have been continuing with our number work too, recognising and counting up to 6!

We have also enjoyed other learning opportunities such as 'Green Day', when we made frogs, ate green food and discovered which colours make green! We loved World Book Day too and having the chance to talk about the different clothes we were wearing and our favourite stories! We are also preparing for spring, and have been busy planting cress seeds. We are excited to see them grow!

This half-term, we have also been preparing for Easter. We have been learning that Lent is a time to be more like Jesus by being kind and looking after each other.

"Green day was fun, it was all green food, green peppers, green beans, just green!"

"I loved planting, we put soil in and some seeds. It growed."









# Reception





### This Half-Term...

Our topic this half-term has been 'Transport including Space'. In literacy, we have explored the book 'How to catch a star' as well as non-fiction texts about Space. We know that non-fiction books contain information. We have learnt lots of facts about different forms of transport including transport into Space.

In Maths, we have been learning about numbers which are one more and one less than a given number. We have also explored making repeating patterns and 3D shapes.

In the creative area, we have design and built playdough aliens. We enjoyed creating an in-depth design, ensuring they were labelled.

In our outdoor bike track, we have had a 'Traffic Controller Station'. To ensure we are using the bikes safely, the children have role played as traffic controllers, helping friends to follow road signs and writing driving offense tickets. We are very safe on the bikes thanks to our friends' support.


## Our children say...

### This Half-Term...

This half-term, both Class 3 and Class 4 have completed their worships surrounding our core value "Faith". Mr Westbrook's class focused on the importance of Lent and how our faith supports us during this time. Miss Ryan's class focused on the importance of having a faith and believing. We already can't wait for our next worships!

In English, we have been focusing on the text, "The Curious Case of the Missing Mammoth". We have continued building our writing skills by starting to add adjectives, suffix and prefixes to our work.

In PE, we have been focusing on dance this half-term in particular street dance. We have learnt a dance based on the movie "Trolls" and have started performing it in pairs/small groups. There are some future dance stars in the making!

During STEM day, we created our very own rafts using recyclable materials. We built the rafts independently and then tested whether they would float when having a weight such as a marble placed on top.

"Maths has been really fun because we have been measuring different objects and seeing what is heavier and lighter. I can use scales now when baking".

"I liked when we learnt the Our Father in Religion as I can say it now at home with my big brother".











### This Half-Term...

In Topic, we have been learning about the five oceans and seven continents. We used salt-dough to create a map of the world and we have learnt a special rap to help us remember the different continents – it's so catchy!

Class 5 performed a special class worship all about Saint Patrick. We told the story of Saint Patrick and we explained how he helped to spread the Christian faith throughout Ireland. We shared some songs and also performed an Irish dance. We had lots of fun and we think we deserve the golden buzzer.

This half-term, we ended STEM day on a high with some 'Silly Science'. The children had a fantastic time joining in with some silly experiments such as 'walking water' and creating our own static electricity with balloons!

Class 6 performed their class worship all about Palm Sunday and how it links to faith. We performed it as a news broadcast and filled it with two lovely songs. Look out Hollywood, we're coming for you!

### This Half-Term...

We started our new topic: From Riches to Ruins, which is all about the Romans. We have had fun being code breakers on our Launch day and finding out about how the Roman army is strong and powerful.

In PE, we have been focusing on gymnastics with Mr Borjus. We have been practising different jumps and rolls making sure our bodies are like perfect gymnasts!

In English, we have been looking at the importance of looking after our oceans and the damage that plastic can sadly do to wildlife, particularly whales.


In Art, we have been focusing on Eric Carle and the wonderful art he produced. We have mixed paint to make our own paper, and cut shapes out of it to make different animals and insects.

### This Half-Term...

In Science, we have been learning about sound. We have loved discovering more about how sound travels and how we hear sound through investigations.

In Computing, we have been using iMovie to create presentations linked to our topic – Rivers. We have learnt how to add sound, videos and how to use transitions to make our work more engaging.

We have been reading a text that has reminded some of us of Moana – we found this very exciting and love discovering more about our character and the adventures she goes on!

In PSHE, we have been learning about how to stay safe online. This has been very useful for us and we have lots of discussions about how we ensure we are using the internet safely.

### Our children say...


"I've enjoyed science and learning by experimenting!"

### This Half-Term...

We have linked our English work to our science learning this half-term by reading the text 'Cosmic'. We have answered questions about the text in Guided Reading sessions as well as writing a non-chronological report and a space fantasy story in Writing lessons.

We thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to take part in the Spanish Café! Waiting on our families, friends and the year 4 pupils was a fantastic chance to practise our Spanish vocabulary and phrases.

In preparation for the upcoming Spanish Exchange experience, we have based our Topic learning around Nigrán. Learning about the geography of Nigrán has helped us to better understand what life for our Spanish pen friends is like – we can't wait to meet them!

In Religion, we have been learning about 'Sacrifice'. Our Lenten topic has helped us to understand the sacrifice that Jesus made for us when he was crucified. We have revisited the story of the Last Supper and Judas' betrayal in order to understand the events of Holy Week in more detail.

### Our children say...

"I have enjoyed learning lots of facts about space in science – did you know, Pluto is a dwarf planet and isn't a planet in our known solar system?" "Spanish café was amazing! I really enjoyed pouring drinks and preparing the food to serve all of the adults and children who came. Fue fenomenal!" "In Topic, we have been learning about Nigrán so I made a map out of modelling clay, bubble wrap, newspaper and tissue paper to show the location of Nigrán."













### This Half-Term...

This half-term, we have been working hard to create descriptive narratives based on our class novel 'The Explorer' and persuasive holiday brochures during English. Year 6 are ready to book their flights!

Biomes has been our focus for Geography as we explored how climate, humans and location can make places on Earth so different.

In Maths lessons, we have learnt how to calculate the area of a variety of shapes and also how to convert measurements.

Our Religion lessons have explored the meaning of 'Death and New Life' in the Catholic church and the significance of this within the liturgical calendar. This has helped us to reflect on the season of Lent and the importance and significance of Jesus' actions and what they mean for us today.

"I really enjoyed our sleep workshop. We learned so much about the importance of a good night's sleep and how to reduce blue light exposure before bedtime."

"I loved our Science lesson where we created classification keys for Liquorice Allsorts. STEM day was also really good fun!"

"I really enjoyed PE this term. I'd never tried Gaelic football before and now I want to continue playing it!"







# Music



The children in EYFS have certainly been getting both 'CREATIVE' and 'ACTIVE' in response to their Music lessons this term e.g. using hoops to identify patterns and leaps within songs and using parachutes and elastic bands to create the motions of rhythm in the song 'Row, row, row your boat'! This exercise was to try to ensure that they mark the pulse accurately and rhythmically with Music.


What our Nursery and Reception children have had to say about Music:

In Year 3, children combined 'CREATIVITY and ART' with some children actively making percussion instruments as a fun accompaniment to songs.

In Year 1, one of the aims and objectives in Music was to engage imaginatively with the music and explore sounds and images through listening to 'Nautilus' by Anna Meredith. The children were highly responsive and really enjoyed using their bodies to demonstrate an internal sense of beat, focusing on the low, high, and rising sounds within the piece using paper plates as a prop!

# Music



Our Famous 'Singing Square' took place last week for our Key Stage 2 pupils, which showcased all the wonderful singing that takes place in each class. Each Year group sang two songs, one of which was sung in a different language. The songs had a theme based on positivity, resilience and following your dreams.







Our choir children performed at our St Patrick's Day celebrations, where we invited parents and parishioners into the community centre for some refreshments and Irish entertainment!

We are so proud of our Year 5 and 6 children who showcased lots of their musical learning and talents during our musical showcase on Wednesday. This was a great opportunity to show off our children's curriculum music learning, including different songs they have been learning to sing and play. A small number of our children who access piano or woodwind tuition were also able to show off some of what they have been learning with their peripetetic teachers. Well done, children!

#### Parking near our school office

We ask that parents please do NOT drive into the car park by our school office.

This can park is always full and has very minimal space for turning around. This makes it a really dangerous area for pedestrians when drivers do not follow our school rules. If you need to access the school office, please park locally and then walk. This will help to keep our children and local community safe.

### **Caritas Ambassadors**

Our Caritas Ambassadors have had a busy half-term caring for our local community and putting their faith into action. Our children expressed their concerns about local parking and put together information for parents and our community to remind everyone to park safely and to prioritise the safety of all of our community, especially our children. Our Caritas Ambassadors have also been raising money for Francis House, our local children's hospice, through selling crocheted chicks with creme eggs inside – a popular treat!




### **Climate Change Champions**

This half term, the Eco Team have been very busy! They have been keeping up the good work in the school with helping Nursery and Reception to begin using the mini compost bins for their fruit waste. They have also been gaining confidence away from the school in a number of different acitivities.

Firstly, the children were invited to participate in holding a climate change stall at the University of Manchester Students' Union, where the children went up to students from all backgrounds and quizzed them on their understanding of climate issues. They went on to present a PowerPoint about how they are actively leading the school in sustainability projects in front of lots of university students in a lecture room. And finally, they went to see a sustainable charity shop called 'Want Not Waste' which is run by students. The children showed incredible confidence, decorum and fantastic oracy skills.

On Wednesday 20th March, some of the Eco Team were able to present information about how we have actively sought to improve our Carbon Footprint at St. Catherine's in front of a hundred adults at a Networking event for East Didsbury called Deeds Not Words. They were magnificent and were a true credit to the school! Last Friday 22nd March, Justin Neal (an Environmental Lawyer) came into school to talk to both KS1 & KS2 about World Water Day and to highlight the importance of clean water in our communities and how we need to protect our water ways. Finally, this Thursday, the Eco Team will be organising an Eco Fair to promote a number of green initiatives.
