Children in Nursery have had a very exciting start to 2022! They recently celebrated Green Day where children dressed up in green clothes and took part in lots of green-themed activities. Every area of Nursery was green, including green water, green playdough and even green food for their food tasting! The children also practised mixing blue and yellow paint together to make the colour green. The children especially loved that some of the Nursery staff dressed up as frogs!

The children also celebrated Chinese New Year. They decorated rice bowls, took part in Chinese food tasting, made their own Chinese takeaway food out of playdough, had a great Chinese display and even did a dragon dance! The children also practised their fine motor skills by picking up rice and noodles with chopsticks.

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Respect





During our Class Worships, we have been thinking about what a good friend is and how we can be a good friend to everyone. We all have kind hands and use them to show love and respect to each other.

Our topic this half term has been 'Polar Animals'. As polar explorers, we have journeyed as far as the Arctic, gathering information about animals that live in cold places.

In Mathematics, we have focused on the composition of numbers to 10 and we can represent number in a variety of ways. We have also been exploring different ways to make 10 and are beginning to write this as a number sentences.

In Literacy, we have created fact files for different polar animals, which was combined to create our first class non-fiction book.

### Our children say...

"I love polar animals. My favourite is polar bears. They are so big and they eat seals. Their coat is white to camouflage."

"I love doing poems for Valentine's Day and polar animals are very exciting. I like an Arctic hare the best because they are so cute and fluffy and they change colour."







Children in Year 1 have been learning lots of new and exciting things and they have been working really hard! Here are some examples of our learning:

In English, we have been writing a journey story focusing on adding suffixes to our writing and using the word "and" to join sentences/clauses.

In Maths, we have been practising our addition and subtraction skills within 20.

In Religion, we have been learning about special people and special places of worship.

In Topic, we have been learning about the difference between human and physical features.

In Science, we have been finding out more about animals including humans (different species of animals/the human body and its functions).

### Our children say...

"This term, we've learnt all about our senses, the church, Chinese New Year and adding 'est' endings."

"We did role play to be the lion and the mouse to see how they would feel. It was great!"







In English, we have been reading our new text 'The Dragon Machine'. The children have been working on subordination, coordination and different sentence types. We created our own flying creatures, then used them as the impetus to write our own version of the story. The children wrote fantastic stories!

In Maths, we have been working on 2D and 3D shapes. We have been learning all about their properties and where we would see them in everyday life. We have also been learning about multiplication and arrays. Learning about multiplication has been one of the best 'times' we've had!

In Topic, we have been learning all about The Great Fire of London, how and why it started and how London changed for the better after it occurred.

In Science, we have been learning all about animals and humans. We learnt about what animals need to survive and we also conducted some experiments to investigate which exercise is the most tiring. We now know how important exercise is for us and we are going to try our very best to get more daily exercise.

### Our children say...

"I loved our Topic day. It really helped me to understand what life was like in 1666."

"I have loved reading The Dragon Machine. Did you know that some dragons even laid eggs in our room?"





Perseverance





Year 3 children have learned about The Stone Age in Topic lessons, which made links to computing sessions – including finding Stone Age sites on Google Earth. To complement our work on The Stone Age, the children were lucky enough to have a virtual reality session, where they were able to experience a Stone Age cave and encountered a cave bear!

In Maths, we have resumed work on 3D shapes, with a focus on the properties of different shapes. They have also been given the opportunity to create their own 3D shapes using play dough and other materials.

During English lessons this half term, the children have become more confident with editing their own work. They are beginning to recognise which areas need correcting and are amending them with greater independence. This is an essential part of the writing process, and the children are starting to grasp the importance of recognising where their work can be improved.

### Our children say...

Whilst getting ready for our virtual reality session in a Stone Age cave, one child said, "I am so lucky to come to this school."

During Children's Mental Health Week, another child said, "The things that have made me happy this week are the library and Wake Up, Shake Up."



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During Music this half term, we were excited to learn to play the guitar. We are beginning to play the tune "Songbird" by Oasis.

In Science, we have planned fun investigations such as 'Does temperature effect the rate of evaporation?'

During Children's Mental Health Awareness week, we discussed people who help us grow. We designed support balloons, identifying people who we can turn to for help.

We have enjoyed the text for English this half term and learned about life in Pompeii before the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. Tranio and Livia are friends caught in this disaster, but manage to escape.

### Our children say...

"I've loved learning about Pompeii and Mount Vesuvius in English!"

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In Maths, we have been focusing on multiplication and division and have mastered the long multiplication method. We have also been improving our speed on TT Rock stars and some of us are nearly Rock Heroes!

In English, we have been learning about Vikings and the Norse Gods. Not only have children been working hard on writing myths, but taking time to write for pleasure, to entertain and to inform. Isaac, Eliza, Rose and Julian wrote an article for the Didsbury post and are now published writers. Many other children in year 5 have been writing, directing and performing their own play.

In Spanish, we have been busy preparing for the Spanish Exchange and we spoke to our pen pals on Google meets. We are getting very excited about finally meeting them this year.

In RE, we have been learning about other faiths. The faith we focused on was Judaism. We explored many different holidays celebrated in the Jewish calendar, and in particular, Purim.

In Science, we have been conducting lots of practical investigations and the children have demonstrated their knowledge of electricity.

In RE, the children learnt about the Jewish faith. We focussed specifically on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

We are so proud of all of the children attending boosters too and putting in such fantastic effort – well done, everyone!

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# **Student Leadership**

### **Caritas Ambassadors**

The Caritas Ambassadors have been meeting weekly to come up with ideas to improve both our school and local community. The first idea that they have come up with for school is to make the peace garden a more welcoming place. They intend to have a 'buddy bench' where children can come and make friends with someone new, or talk to someone if they feel lonely. This will be announced during worship and the children have designed posters to explain the ethos of the buddy bench. The ambassadors worked fantastically as a team and devised a rota for this to be achieved over the next half-term. They also hope to have support from volunteers to run a gardening club in the peace garden so that it can be more aesthetically appealing too.

### **School Council**

The School Council took part in a Mental Health Workshop this half-term, led by our Caritas social worker, Michelle. They learnt all about how to support good mental health across the school and how they can be ambassadors for this in their important school leadership positions. They came up with some great ideas for improving mental health in their classrooms including 'feel good affirmations', empowering statements on display, weekly compliments, more mindfulness sessions, worry boxes/wellbeing wells and many more ideas too. They are also very excited for when our two new sensory rooms are complete, which our PTA has funded. The children also 'floated the idea' of a therapy dog!

### **GIFT** Team

Our GIFT Team has been working diligently each week to prepare and perform dramas based around the weekly Gospel. Their performances are then shown to every year group in our weekly worships and are helping the children to understand the Word of God more clearly and deeply. They have also been working with Mrs Simi to come up with lots of ideas for how they can have a greater impact across the school.

#### Headteacher Recruitment

A number of our school leaders were also part of our Headteacher recruitment process this half-term. They certainly asked some challenging questions and they very much enjoyed playing their part in the appointment of our new headteacher. Well done to everyone involved!
