Nursery





This Half-Term...

Our Topic this half term has been Space! We have listened to Space stories, sang many songs and learnt about our Solar system.

In Maths, we have been learning about patterns and made our own Easter egg patterns using paint.

The children loved having visitors in our Nursery for Stay and Play. The Daffodil display is amazing!

We celebrated all things Yellow during our Yellow day. We learnt about spring, yellow foods, yellow animals and all things yellow. We even sang, 'We all live in a yellow Submarine.'

Our children say...

"I like Yellow day the best and playing with yellow things."

"I made a Easter card and I liked painting it."

"I loved finding eggs and making Easter baskets!"





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This Half-Term...

Our topic this half term has been 'Space.' We have enjoyed investigating astronauts in the literacy text 'Man on the Moon: A day in the life of Bob'. Our role play areas became space stations and we have gathered lots of facts about space, the moon and aliens.

To celebrate the season of spring we have grown cress seeds to develop our understanding of the world. We know what a plant needs to grow and the different parts of a plant.

We were challenged to design an alien and sculpt this carefully with playdough. We needed to ensure the finished model looked like our design and labelled the different parts independently.

In our creative area, we have made cosmic collages, using different materials to create the milky way.

Our children say...

"Aliens are from space. The moon is made of rocks, not cheese!"

"I know all about the whole world. It's called Earth this planet. Bob works on the moon. He's an astronaut'.

"I know number twelve. You need a ten and a two to make twelve."









This Half-Term...

This half-term, children in Year 1 have been working extremely hard and have learnt lots of different things. We have been learning the following in each subject:

English: we have been writing an adventure story focusing on adding –ed endings, punctuation such as exclamation and question marks to a sentence and writing in both the present and past tense.

Maths: we have been learning all about measurement.

Religion: we have been learning to understand the Sacrament of the Eucharist and preparing for Easter

Topic: we've been learning all about animals including humans (different species of animals and features animals have).

Our children say...

"I have enjoyed Topic and how I can help whales and turtles!".

"I like the book we have been learning because it is funny and makes me laugh!"

"In PE, I can do a forward roll and I couldn't do that before".

"I love Show and Tell because I get to see things everybody in class brings in and I might not have seen somethings before".











This Half-Term...

In English, we have been focusing on our book called Major Glad and Major Dizzy. We have made our own soldiers and created suitable instructions. We have also been focusing on writing in the present and past progressive tense.

In Religion, we have been looking at Mass and the different parts of it. The children celebrated Mass with Year 6 and it was a very special and important day for us as it was our first class mass since we were in Reception.

In Maths, we have been working on dividing and finding fractions of shapes and amounts. We have been using our people method to find the answers and reading our questions carefully.

In Topic, we have been learning about the five oceans and seven continents. We have been using iPads to research the different continents and creating our own fact sheets about them. We have also become rap stars, rapping along to our continents rap.

Our children say...

"I loved making the fruit kebabs because it was so yummy that we got to eat them."

"World Book day was so much fun. I got to learn about lots of new words!"

"Making a friend for Major Glad was tricky, but it looked so cool when I finished."





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This Half-Term...

In Maths this half-term, we have used objects from the real world to advance our understanding of measurement and fractions. We sorted a wide range of ingredients in order of their weight. At the end of March, we finished this term's study of fractions with our 'foodie fractions' lesson – examining fractions made from apples, cucumber, oranges and sandwich wraps!

In Science, we have just concluded our unit of study on Light. The children enjoyed their challenges to make reflections.

In Religion, we have studied a number of Saints recently. These include Saint Valentine, Mother Teresa and Blessed Oscar Romero. These lessons have inspired the children to consider the transformative nature of faith. Our chosen Saints have also been a focus for some Class Worships.

Our children say...

"I like maths and have enjoyed learning about fractions."

"Learning about Oscar Romero made me feel closer to God."

"I have enjoyed everything this term, but Science and Topic are my favourite lessons."









This Half-Term...

Our Science unit this half-term has been 'Electricity'. We have had lots of fun making circuits with a lamp, batter, buzzer and a motor!

In Maths, we have been learning all about fractions and decimals. We have explored tenths on a numbers line and learnt how to divide a whole number by 10 and even 100!

During the United for Ukraine day, we wrote letters to school children in the UK. We made them as bright and colourful as possible with lots of words to encourage hope and positivity.

In Religion, we have explored 'Giving and Receiving'. We learnt about different part of mass, including the Penitential Rite and the Communion Rite.

Our children say...

"I have really enjoyed learning about fractions – it was fun!" "I like reading our story in English. It's called "When the Giant Stirred" and it's about villagers on an island where there's a volcano."

"I really enjoyed writing letters during the United for Ukraine day – it was good to show support for children who are suffering."











This Half-Term...

Year 5 began their Earth and Space topic with a visit from a mobile planetarium! We really enjoyed learning about the wonders of the Universe.

In English, we read 'The Darkest Dark' by the Canadian astronaut Chris Hadfield, which we found really interesting. We have also written biographies about him.

In Art, we have studied the Victorian artist William Morris and we have created our own William Morris inspired wallpaper.

In P.E., we created gymnastic sequences by linking together modes of travelling, static balances and jumps with appropriate transitions.

Our children say...

"My favourite science lesson was creating the phases of the moon with Oreo cookies!"

"The planetarium was amazing!"

"I really enjoyed making mini books on World Book day."





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This Half-Term...

In RE, we visited Manchester Jewish Museum, where we participated in activities to develop our knowledge of Judaism and began to make further links between this faith and Catholicism. We also got to make iMovies about what we had learnt and looked at artefacts too.

In Topic, we had a, 'Ration Bake Off,' where we had to make cakes and biscuits, that they would have made during World War Two. Therefore, we could only use food items that would have been available as well. This meant there were some very unusual sweet treats for us to try!

We had our first Mass of the year with our partner year group, Year Two, and it was so special to be able to share this with them.

Writing letters to Ukraine was really important to us, as we felt it was a way to provide them with some comfort at this time.

Our children say...

"I loved the bake off! I am not sure whether I enjoyed the carrot cookies though!"

"The Jewish Museum was really interesting and I learnt a lot more about this faith too."

"Writing letters to Ukraine made me feel like I could give them hope, even though I am so far away."
