
Perseverance

What is the Foundation Stage?

The Foundation Stage is the period of education from age three to five, which offers a play-based, child centred curriculum in line with the Early Years Foundation Stage. Children learn best through play and exploration. During the day there will be a mixture of adult initiated, child initiated and adult led activities as well as whole class and small group activities.

There are four guiding principles that shape practice in every Early Years settings, these are:

- Every child is a unique, competent learner from birth and can be resilient, capable, confident and self assured.
- Children learn to be strong and independent through positive relationships.
- Children learn and develop well in enabling environments, in which their experiences respond to their individual needs and there is a strong partnership between practitioners and parents and/or carers.
- Children develop and learn in different ways and at different rates.





More activities to share at home.

Some simple games for all the family to play:

- Snakes and ladders
- Large jigsaw puzzles with big pieces
- Snap or other matching games
- Colour or picture dominoes
- I Spy and other guessing games
- Picture lotto

More things you may like to do:

- Ball games
- Singing games
- Play dough
- Lego
- Sand and water
- Skipping games
- Cutting out activities
- Large scale mark making/ drawing with chalks and chunky pens

Remember learning should be fun and exciting and involve lots of new experiences. Spend no longer than 10 minutes per activity to maintain levels of concentration!

Always praise and reward your child's efforts in order to build their confidence and self-esteem.

Top Tips for Starting School

Activities to share at home.

- Helping you around the house, e.g. setting the table, washing up, putting the shopping away.
- Sitting together looking at a book and listening to stories.
- Visiting places together like the park, supermarket, station, bank, library etc.
- Singing rhymes and reading stories together.
- Collecting things like buttons, shells, postcards or pebbles for counting and sorting.

Talking together

A child learns a lot from talking.

Talk about:

- What happened today
- What you did today
- A television programme
- Things you like/dislike
- The games your child plays with other children

Listening Skills

It is important a child learns to listen. You can help by:

- Reading stories
- Learning rhymes and songs
- Showing and explaining how things work.



Religious Education

As a Catholic School, Religious Education is at the heart of our curriculum and feeds into all areas of learning. We aim to bring our children closer to God and help them to know him as a loving father.

What does the Foundation Stage involve?

There are seven areas of learning and development in the Foundation Stage, all of which are important and inter-connected.

Prime Areas of Learning

The Prime areas are fundamental, work together and move through to support development in all other areas.

- Communication and Language (CL)
- Physical Development (PD)
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSE)

Specific Areas of Learning

The Specific areas include essential skills and knowledge for children to participate successfully in society.

- Literacy (L)
- Mathematics (M)
- Understanding the World (UW)
- Expressive Arts and Design (EAD)



All school communication, payments and consent are made through ParentMail. At least one parent must have a ParentMail account.

All new parents should now have had an email to register for a Parentmail account. If you have not yet had a registration email, please contact the school office.

We regularly use Parentmail to send important information regarding your child and the school.

St. Catherine's is a cashless school office and are unable to accept cash or cheque's as payment for school trips, dinner money or extra curricular activities. All payments must be processed via ParentMail.

Attendance

It is really important that the children make a good start to their Primary School career by being in school every day. We know that children pick up all sorts of bugs and colds when they start school but they soon build up their resilience.

All absences are classed as unauthorised unless a satisfactory explanation is received. Holidays should be taken outside term time so that this does not impact on attendance. Holidays in term time will be recorded as unauthorised unless there are exceptional circumstances.

There are many incentives and rewards for attendance. We aim for 98% attendance throughout the year as this means that the children are much more likely to achieve their true potential when they are in school consistently.


If you are late to school and the entrance door to you child's classroom is closed, you must go to the school office and sign in.

Topics

All areas of learning will be built around these topics.

Parental Involvement

Throughout the academic year, we will provide lots of opportunities for you as parents and carers to become involved in lots of different events such as 'Stay and Play' and 'Parent Craft' sessions with your child at school.

Dates for different events will be in the parent calendar and on the school newsletter.

Phonics

We follow the Letters and Sounds scheme for Phonics. We hold a

Reading and Phonics meeting in September. Please keep a look out for the date.

Outdoor Provision

We go outside whatever the weather! Please ensure your child has appropriate clothing and footwear for all weathers: raincoats, wellies, sunhats, etc. We will happily store these in school for your child to use when needed.

Snack

Children have the option of helping themselves to a healthy snack throughout the day, provided by school. Please also send in a labelled water bottle for your child. This needs to be still. unflavoured water.

PE

Children will require a PE kit after Christmas. This consists of maroon PE shorts, a white t-shirt and black pumps or trainers. No laces please! As with all uniform, please label everything.

Special Mention Worship

This takes place at the end of each week and the School GIFT Team lead part of this, sharing a message based on the Gospel for that week. As part of our worship, highlights of the week are celebrated and two children from each class receive a 'Special Mention' Award. There are many reasons your child may get an award, including hard work, behaviour, effort or their kindness to others.

Children are also encouraged to bring in any awards or certificates they have received outside of school, such as dance trophies or swimming certificates so these can be shared and celebrated.

Reception

School Day:

School starts at 8.45am, however, the doors open at 8.30am to give the children chance to come into school as they arrive.
School finishes at 3.00pm.
Please make sure we know who is going to be picking up your child each day.

Lunchtimes

Currently all Reception children are eligible for a universal free school meal. However some children may be eligible for free school meal funding. Please see the school office for more information or visit: http://www.manchester.gov.uk/ info/500186/education benefits/7355/ free school meals/1
Alternatively, you may provide your child with a healthy packed lunch.

Reading

Reading is such an important part of learning. Your children will bring books home for you to share. Please take the time to read with or to your child every day – it makes such a big difference! Please use the reading record as a communication log between home and school and record when you have read with your child. Books will be changed weekly and your child will be given a set day to change their books.

We also record when your child has completed a guided reading session in their reading records, so please ensure they are brought into school everyday.

We now have a wonderful new library. The children will access this each week and will be able to choose a book to bring home. Again, books will be changed weekly.

More information on reading in Reception will be given in September, at our Reading and Phonics meeting.



Homework

We will start to send work home after October half term. Activities will be sent home on a Friday and we ask that homework is returned to school by the following Tuesday. Homework is usually always phonics based.



Here at St. Catherine's, we use an app called Evidence Me to record the children's observations. Please ensure you provide school with an email address in order to receive observations of your child. Parental Input

We value your input as parents and encourage you to share your own observations, which can become part of your child's learning journey. Simply respond to the email sent to you with your observations. These can then be added to your child's learning journey.

Passwords

We ask that all parents set up a 'password' which is to be used in case of an emergency when you need somebody different to collect your child from school. You will receive a notification via Parentmail to provide us with this information before September.

PTA

The PTA is run by volunteer parents whose main aim is to raise funds for the school, but it also provides a forum for socialising and organising community activities. Every parent at school is automatically a member of the PTA. Everyone is encouraged to get involved and to come along to meetings. Help is always appreciated at events – the more the merrier! Further information is provided within your welcome pack.

Lunches

Nursery children should bring a healthy packed lunch into school on the days they attend. Nursery A only need to bring their lunch on Monday and Tuesday.

Snack

Children have snack time mid morning, where they are offered milk and fruit or vegetables.
Please let us know if your child has any allergies.
Please also send your child into school with a labelled bottle filled with still, unflavoured water only.

Drop Off and Collection

Children should be dropped off and collected from the Early Years Entrance.

If you need to collect your child early, please contact the school office.

This entrance is also used by Year 1, so please stand clear of the door until 8.50am. Your child's teacher will greet you on the door each morning when it is time to go into Nursery.



The Brush Bus

We follow the NHS scheme to improve dental health. After having lunch, the children in Nursery brush their teeth. We think that this is really important to teach children about how they can be healthy and look after their bodies. Please see the enclosed leaflet in your packs for more information. This scheme is started once the children have successfully settled into Nursery.

Outdoor Provision

We go outside whatever the weather. Please ensure your child has appropriate clothing and footwear for all weathers: raincoats, wellies, sunhats, etc. We will happily store these in school for your child to use when needed. Please make sure these items are labelled.

Spare Clothes

We would encourage parents to provide a spare set of school clothes and underwear to be kept in school in case of an accident.



Please make sure EVEYRTHING is labelled.



For those eligible for 30 hours funding, please ensure you let us know your code as soon as possible. We will need you to re-confirm your eligibility as required, each term. Failure to do so could mean that you have to pay for the additional hours your child attends Nursery.
